FIGHT THE POWER!



Direct action against the Criminal Justice Act intensified as activists held a rooftop trespass of MP Peter Atkinson's home in early Febuary.

Following a march in Newcastle, plans to occupy MP Neville Trotter's roof had to be abandoned due to heavy

police presence, with all the harassment and intimidation that can be expected in our democratic land.

The march dispersed and those more determined to make their point drove over to Atkinson's home in Birtley. near Hexham.

For two hours a red and black anarcho-syndicalist flag and anti-CJA banners were flown by a dozen protestors sitting on top of Atkinson's huge house in full view of television cameras and police, including a helicopter, while the garden below was packed with more protesters.

The event was seen all over the country on TV, whilst in the North it caused a week of articles in local

Although the protest was over the CJA, many there felt they had a score to settle after Atkinsons behaviour in Parliament when he blocked proposals for tighter veal trade legislation being heard by reading out a telephone book.

Despite police harassment as people left, there was no arrests. Lets make every action a Direct Action! -R



Apaches fight off attempt to turn reservation into waste dump

HE heirs of Geronimo have fought off an attempt to turn Apache land into a dump for radioactive nuclear waste, writes Jonathan Freedland in Washington.

Members of the Mescalero Apache tribe voted down a proposal to store several thousand tons of spent nuclear fuel rods on their reservation in New Mexico. Opposition to the move was led by Joseph Geronimo, grandson of the famous warrior.

Leaders of the tribe had sought approval for a contract with a waste consortium that could have earned the Apache up to \$250 million (about £170 million) for 40 years of storage. Advocates of the deal said it would help alleviate the tribe's 36 per cent unemployment and 50 per cent poverty rates, but opponents said their spectacular landscape risked becoming a permanent dump.

French Lesson

The recent agitation by French seafarers at Channel ferry ports raises a number of questions. The main lesson for us on this side of the water is that the French blocaded in defense of jobs and wage rates, at a time when most people on this side only seem to contemplate such action over animal welfare.

The French were protesting that British company Meridian Ferries were using Polish seafarers paid a quarter of French seafarers' rates. Their direct action in blocading ports (and even setting alight one of the freight ferries) paid off when the company announced that it would only use French or British crew from now on.

The extent to which the French action was dictated by wage rate or xenophobic concerns is hard to say. Reports of "France for the French" graffiti in Boulogne are worrying, though this could just be Front Nationale types jumping on the bandwagon. The Secretary General of the CGT union seafarer's branch in Dunkirk said: "While we have nothing against these Polish seamen, their abysmal wages, which are a quarter of ours, force down the pay of seamen everywhere."

On the other hand the CGT -dominated by the Communist Party-was involved in attacks on immigrant workers in the early eighties, before the rise of Le Pen. But the French seafarers are apparently prepared to accept British crew, even though they're a third cheaper than French seafarers would be...

Rather than target the Poles (and before them cheap Romanian and Chinese crews) and calling for only European Union nationals to be employed, a more enlightened demand would be for wages to be paid at French levels <u>irrespective</u> of the nationality of the seafarer. To say otherwise is to risk being carried along on the tide of xenophobia and Euro-racism. (And this in two



countries like Britain and France built on successive waves of immigration too.)

Another twist to the tale is that Meridian Ferries is trying to get into the cross Channel animal export business in order to make a killing, so to speak. If their plans get off the ground we'll be faced with the sight of massed ranks of British protesters battling the same company at Folkstone over veal calves and sheep. (Horses are probably the next issue - those nasty continentals eat them, Brits only feed them to their cats and dogs...) And what a pity these people didn't support the British seafarers' strike in the eighties, and left the defence of a decent wage for humans on cross-Channel ferries to the French this time.

Bertolt Brecht apparently said that those who oppose fascism without opposing capitalism "are like people who wish to eat their veal without slaughtering the calf". There's a message there for British animal welfarists and any xenophobic French seafarers. In other words, THERE'S NO SUBSTITUTE FOR CLASS!

If only it were real...
The hunt is on for those responsible for the beheading of a valuable bronze statue called the King and Queen by Henry Moore. The double whammy has been condemned by bores from the art world and the pigs alike. The statue was used as decoration in a mansion on a 3000 acre estate and hunting for the missing heads should prove quite a feat!

January saw a member of Tyneside Anarchist Group up in court charged with the new crime of trespass. Having been out on a hunt-sab when nabbed, the case naturally received a lot of interest, even from the trotskyites (presumably keen to somehow claim something a victory for trotskyism).

This is believed to be the first prosecution under the CJA, and our man in TAG was bound over for a year with £100 court costs - which were paid by a stranger who was pissed off by red-coatted yobbo's tearing up the fields around her home - hats off to that person!

Shit for Brains!

Billingham nazi David Draper was conviicted at Teeside Crown Court on the 22nd Febuary. Unfortunately the judge decided against a prison sentence and merely ordered 180 hours community service. (This is one instance when even we anarchists, prison abolitionists though we are, would have been tempted to call for the key to be thrown away!)

Draper was convicted of nine offences (under the Public Order Act) of possessing racially inflamatory material with the intention of displaying, publishing and distributing it to stir up racial hatred. Police had found anti-semitic and anti-black stickers, literature and other documents in Draper's flat in two separate raids. (Oh dear, this supposed C18 stormtrooper isn't very quick on the uptake, is he?)

Senticing Draper, "Justice" Holland said he would have jailed him if there'd been any evidence that the material was distributed (obviously another amazing intellect at work here!) and that he didn't want to make a martyr of Draper by imprisoning him. Which bares out what we said in Anarchy!\$3 - that you cannot rely on the bourgeois State to deal with fascism.

From what we gather, Draper apparently has portraits of Hitler and Himmler on his walls of home, that's in addition to the union jack hanging in his window. He was once done for a bomb hoax at Dunnes supermarket, the thinking being presumably that it's Irish-owned, and the Billingham National Socialist Freikorps(BNSF) - we kid you not! - priding themselves on supporting the loyalist paramilitaries in northern Ireland.

Draper's own father summed up the case best perhaps when he was quoted after the trial as saying: "My son's head is full of crap." Meantime, while C18 and Blood & Honour stickers have seemed to have stopped going up in Billingham, Draper and crew are still unrepentant fascists (he didn't even try and hide it at the trial).

We heard that he got into a heate argument with a marxist in The Swan i Billingham. On this occasion another o the regulars put a stop to the nonsens by ejecting Draper from the pub, th other two aryan warriors with hi beating a strategic retreat! Someon else believes in anti-fascist action i would seem. ---

Nice 'n' Sleazy

The world seems to be floating on a tide of sleaze. Come to think of it, "sleaze" is a very nineties word, isn't it? Perhaps in the next century we'll talk of the "sleazy nineties" in the way we talk of the "swinging sixties"...

In Italy there's the Tangentopoli scandels that permeated every level of the system; in France various financial scandels, the fraud trial of the Mayor of Lyons etc; in Spain the "Socialist" Party government is inundated by one scandel after another - not least, complicity in the GAL death squads that killed 26 people in a covert dirty war against Basque "terrorists" in the eighties; in Belgium the governing parties are reeling from the Augusta bribes scandel; in Mexico, ex-government ministers are accused of conspiracy in assassinations and receiving payoffs from drugs cartels smuggling narcotics to the USA through Mexico; in the USA the Clintons are dogged by the Whitewater affair; in Russia organised crime recently shot dead the most famous Russian TV personality, apparently in a turf-war over control of TV advertising.

At one time the British ruling-class would be able to claim with a straight face that such excesses were to be expected amongst Latins and continentals, but not in the country of the "mother of Parliaments". After Westminster Council, Jeffery Archer, Neil Hamilton, obscene executive pay rises in the privitised utilities, Barings Bank etc. only the hopelessly naive will swallow this.

Corruption and graft is endemic to the capitalist system, not an aberration. Most people are so worried about being burgled by some little shit on the estate or meeting muggers in a dark street that they don't notice the big time criminals dressed in expensive suits who mug and rob us without getting their hands dirty, namely big buisness and politicians.

There's a good bit in "The Godfather" where the Al Pacino character is defending his mafia family to his New England wasp girlfriend (Diane Keaton), sayingthat his father only did "what all great men do". The Keaton character says that he's naive and that "governments don't have people killed". To which Pacino replies "who's being naive now?".

Capitalism and government are the biggest rackets, even if they are legally sanctioned, and if some gangster calls himself a "businessman" to appear respectable, he's being more truthful than a politician ever will be. -- D

NATURAL BORN KILLERS

The execution of British-born convicted murderer Nicholas Ingram in Georgia recently highlighted the issue of the death penalty, increasingly used in the USA since its widespread reintroduction in 1976.

Some of the prisoners on death row committed horrendous crimes, and if it was a case of the victims pulling the trigger, personally I wouldn't lose too much sleep. But not when it's the State, an institution guilty of all manner of crimes alongside which even the most barbaric serial killer is a novice, which sits in judgement.

As with the general prison population, working class and black Americans predominate on the death row conveyor belt. Yet another reflection of class society. This is where the sad, bad or simply unlucky who don't fit into this warped society end up. To be gassed, hanged, electrocuted. lechally injected or shot to death in the name of a society that spawned them in the first place.

Reading accounts of the sadistic pleasure taken by the prison quards getting Ingram ready to go to the electric chair, it's obvious that cold blooded murder isn't only on one side.

The State also frequently gets it wrong. If the death penalyt had been in

operation in Britain. all miscarriage of justice cases of recent years would have been academic. The Guilford 4, Birmingham 6, Judith Ward, the Carl Bridgewater case (soon hopefully) etc. That's a good start to posthumous pardons, some to people whose only crime was to be quilty of being Irish in the wrong place, at the wrong time.

And it's not only murderers who get judicially slain by the State. 'Red' scares have been an episodic feature in the USA. It's enough to recall the Chicago Martyrs hung in 1887 for being anarchists and organisers of a strike for the 8 hour day in 1886 (that's how the first May Day came about). Or Joe Hill the IWW organiser, killed by firing squad in Utah in 1915 for the crime of being a syndicalist. Or Sacco and Vanzetti, who went to the chair in 1926 because they were anarchists and immigrants. Or the Rosenburgs, killed in the fifties at the height of the cold war. All now accepted as being falsely accused. In the case of the Chicago Martyrs and Sacco and Venzetti they were posthumously pardoned by the State, too late.

Prisons are the biggest crime, class society the cause!

Solidarity Federation

The Solidarity Federation (IWA). launched a year ago, just recently held its annual conference. Amongst stuff discussed over the two day meeting was a review of the past year which examined the expansion of the Norwich Solidarity Centre - the local centre for the Norwich SolFed - and the launch of the Red & Black Club - South London's local.

Also looked at was the Networks, which aim to form the nucleus to future anarcho-syndicalist unions. Although things are at a early stage still, with a lot of hard work the SolFed hope to make the kind of impact of its sister organisations around the world. including the CNT in Spain and the USI in Italy.

The SolFed have a refreshingly downto-earth feel about them compared to many of the anarchists you could meet. They organise themselves on both industrial and community levels and do not draw distinctions between the two. The big plan is to overthrow capitalism and the State and bring about workers control - but fighting for the here and now issues are certainly part of the fight.

We at Anarchy! look forward to reporting any new happenings from the SolFed, and wish them well for the coming year.
